Ice Breaker: Categories

Arrange students in a circle.

Activity:

One person thinks of a category, then the group takes turns naming items that fit in the category. When one of the participants can't name another thing in the current category, s/he is out; the game continues until one of the last two players can't continue. But the other player doesn't win unless s/he can name another item in that category. (Sample Categories: characters on The Simpsons, cities or countries that begin with a certain letter, things that are yellow, kinds of trees, brands of soda, cartoon shows).
